Regulatory Authority

- 105 CMR 400.00 (State Sanitary Code, Ch. I)
 400.100 <u>Inspection Authority</u>
 "... authorized to enter, examine, or survey at any reasonable time such places as they consider necessary..."
- 105 CMR 410.000 (State Sanitary Code, Ch. II)
 410.001 <u>Purpose</u>

"... protect the health, safety, and well-being of the occupants of housing and general public ..."

Inspection Authority

 The local board of health/health department may conduct an inspection upon receiving
 Occupant's consent
 Administrative search warrant

 A health inspector may not enter a dwelling under the authority of
 Fire department
 Police department

Inspection Responsibility

If an inspection reveals a dwelling is not in compliance with 150 CMR 410.000
Issue an Order to Correct Violations
Within 12 hours for violations described in 410.830(A)
Within 7 days for violations described in 410.830(B)
Conduct a re-inspection

Within 5 days of compliance requirements stated in order

Regulatory Citations

A variety of violations may exist ■ 410.180 Potable Water Quantity and pressure ■ 410.256 Temporary Wiring ■ No access to outlets ■ 410.351 Owner's Responsibilities Install and maintain required equipment Installed optional equipment 410.352 Occupant's Responsibilities Install and maintain equipment

Maintain, clean and sanitary, required equipment

Additional citations

- 410.451 Egress Obstructions
 - Free from obstruction by owner & occupant
- 410.505 Structural Elements
 - Reasonable care in use of floors, walls, etc.
- 410.602 Maintenance of Areas
 - Free from garbage & rubbish
- 410.750 Conditions Deemed to Endanger
 - Condemnation?

Unfit for Human Habitation

410.831 Dwellings Unfit for Habitation Issue written finding of condition Description of the conditions resulting in the finding Notification of finding ■ To occupant & owner Include provision for hearing Hearing to determine fitness ■ Unless immediate danger to life or health

Unfit for Human Habitation

■ 410.831 continued, ■ Condemnation Order condemning dwelling or portion Order to vacate dwelling or portion Relocation responsibilities Order to secure dwelling or portion Demolition ■ No compliance after 1 year

Court

- Housing Court
 - Civil process allows for development of a plan
- District Court
 - May be less likely to extend periods of time for resolution
- Mediation
 - Agreement to a plan must be signed by all parties
 Include time frames or phases for completion
 Is defendant capable of meeting time frames
 - Include mechanism to return to court

■ When is clean "clean enough?" Consider violations cited in order Specific violations cited must be corrected Important to be thorough in citing violations Additional codes that impact safety ■ Local fire inspector will have combustion/rescue concerns Building inspector will have structural concerns Periodic follow-up ■ Is someone available to check in
